On 5 August, 1967, the platoon of 155mm Guns at (YD 620095) were released from OPCON 1st FAG and its support of Operation CUMBERLAND and returned to the Battery position at PHU BAI, RVN (YD 893127).

During the month of August, the Battery continued to improve its defensive positions and defensive counter-attack plans. Two bunkers were rebuilt and additional wire was laid to better channelize the enemy into pre-designed killing zones. Four new counter-rocket plans were put in effect to provide more rapid and more accurate response.

As part of the battalion's overall security measures the Battery ran 7 night patrols and put out 4 listening post.

1. a. Combat Missions Assigned

1 August, 1967 - 1st Platoon, 1st 155mm Gun Battery (SP), OPOON to 1st Field Artillery Group, General Support, Operation CUMBERLAND, and Direct Support designated Recon Patrol.

e. Logistics

(1) General. During this period the Battery remained ADCON/OPOON of 4th Battalion, 12th Marines.

(2) Supply. The overall supply picture is satisfactory. Major items still on loan are:

(3) Maintenance. During this period, several 155mm Guns (SP), M-53, have been deadlined for recoil cylinders and for sight mount problems. At present one weapon is deadlined awaiting replacement parts, two oil lines.

(4) Bunkers and Perimeter Security. During the month of August, two bunkers were completely rebuilt. A continued wire laying effort has resulted in a network of wire designed to both impede and channelize the enemy.

(5) Water. The Battery continues to truck water from the Division Water Point.

f. Civic Action. During this period the battery continued its Civic Action Program in the village of Lee Bon (TD 926130). During the month a school house was completed and instruction begun on the raising of pigs. During the month, 1631 villagers received medical treatment. Several Dent Cops were also held. A program will shortly be initiated to train Vietnamese civilians in basic First Aid so that they can eventually participate in the medical phase of the Civic Action Program.

g. Administration. The Battery is ADCON, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines.
