LA CATIVE SUMARY

In the early hours of 6 April, 2 Companies of the 800th Battalion along with the C112 Sapper Unit attacked the ARVN & USMC camp at FK 17 YD (647277) with a mortar barrage and ground attack. After overruning the ARVN portion of the camp, the Viet Cong turned on the 8" Howitzer Platoon. Using small arms, automatic weapons, Grenades and the direct fire of the 8" Howitzer the Marines held the perimeter for bours before the Viet Cong withdrew. The platoon lost 1 USMC KIA, 1 USN KIA, 8 USMC WIA and one 8" Howitzer out of action due to a direct hit with a mortar round. The enemy losses were 20 KIA (Conf) and 40 KIA (Prob).

The platoon was taken under mortar attack on the 7th and 17th. Counter mortar fire was brought down on the positions using 155mm Howitzer fires from the Bighorn 40 and direct fire from the 8" Howitzer. Negative USMC WIA in either encounter.

On 21 April the platoon displaced to Bighorn AO for further displacement to Shawnee AO. On 23 April the 8" Howitzer Platoon was placed Opcon under 1st 8" Howitzer Battery.

During this period the battery's training program included GMS classes in the N-60 machine gun, first aid (Heat Casualties) 50 caliber machine gun, small unit tactics, and mine warfare. This training was supplemented with FAM fires in the .45 pistol, M-60 machine gun, 50 caliber machine gun, and .45 caliber submachine gun. Two formal classes and demonstrations were given in direct fire of the 155mm Gun.

At 0130 on the 28th the Phu Bai combat base was taken under mortar attack from vic. YD (891116). An outpost spotted the flashes and the battery was the first in the

Phu Bai perimeter to take the enemy position under attack, firing 50 caliber machine guns and the M42 Army 40mm A.A. gun. During this time the battery fired counter-rocket plans as directed by 3rdBn, 26th Marines. A morning patrol revealed the batterys counter-mortar fire netted 7 KIA. This battery had only 2 minor WIA.

MARRATIVE SUMMARY

In the early hours of 6 April, two companies of the 200th Battalien along with Cll2 Sepper Unitattecked the ARVN & USMC camp at FK 17 (YD 547277) with a mortar barrage and ground attack. After overruning the ARVN position of the camp, the Viet Cong turned on the 8" Howitzer Flatoon. Using small arms, automatic weapons, grenades and the direct fire of the 8" Howitzer the Marines held the perimeter for 3 hours before the Viet Cong withdrew. The platoc lost 1 USMC KIA, 1 USN KIA, 7 USMC WIA and one 8" Howitzer was put out of the due to a direct hit with a mortar round. The enemy losses were 20 KIA (***) and 40 KIA (Prob).

The plateen was taken under mortar attack on the 7th and 17th. Counter mertar was brought down on the positions using 155mm Howitzer fures from the DEC HORN AO and direct fire from the 8" Howitzer. One USMC WIA was sustained on 7 April.

On 21 April the platoon displaced to BIG HORN AO for further displacement to SHAWNEE AO. On 23 April the 8" Howitzer Platoon was placed OPCON under let 3" Howitzer Battery.

During this period the battery's training program included GMS classes in the M.-50 machine gun, first aid (Heat Casualties), 50 caliber machine gun, small unit tactics, and mine warfare. This training was supplemented with FAM fires in the .45 pistol, M.-60 machine gun, 50 caliber machine gun, and .45 caliber submachine gun. Two formal classes and demonstrations were given in direct fire of the 155mm Gun.

At 0130 on the 28th the PHU BAI combat base was taken under mortar attack from the vicinity of (YD 891116). An outpost spotted the flashes and the battery was the first in the PHU BAI perimeter to take the enemy position under attack, firing 50 caliber machine guns and the M42 40mm A.A. gun. Puring this time the battery fired counter rocket plans as directed by 3d Bn. 26th Marines.
