### HARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 5 August, 1967, the platoon of 155mm Guns at (YD 620095) were released from OPCON lst FAG and its support of Operation CUMBERLAND and returned to the Battery position at PHU BAI, RVN (YD 893127).

During the month of August, the Battery continued to improve its defensive positions and defensive counter-attack plans. Two bunkers were rebuilt and additional wire was laid to better channelize the enemy into predesigned killing zones. Four new counter-rocket plans were put in affect to provide more rapid and more accurate response.

As part of the battalion's overall security measures the Battery ran ? night patrols and put out 4 listening post.

- f. Civic Action. During this period the battery continued its Civic Action Programin the village of Loc Bon (TD 926130). During the month a school house was completed and instruction begun on the raising of pigs. During the month, 1631 villagers received medical treatment. Several Dent Ceps were also held. A program will shortly be initiated to train Vietnamese civilians in basic First Aid so that they can eventually participate in the medical phase of the Civic Action Program.


