PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During August the Battery continued to improve its position areas. An extensive rebuilding program was continued on ammunition bunkers, personnel bunkers, fighting holes and the FDC bunker. Also the "A" position (YD 92530708) continued to improve its position by widening the gun pit areas, and improving and rebuilding the ready-pit bunkers. Three ammunition bunkers were built and an FDC bunker is nearly completed at the "A" position.

As of 31 August 1968, the Battery had 83% of its authorized strength. The Battery has a shortage of MOS O(11 which is at 73% of authorized strength. The Battery has 47% of its authorized Staff NCOs, eight of a required 17.

b. Intelligence. The Battery mans Tower E of the Phu Bai perimeter OP towers and aids in rocket/mortar target acquisition. Other intelligence and target acquisition data is obtained from the S-2, 1st F4C.

c. Organization and Operation. The Battery participated in Operation Houston during the month of August 1968.

d. Training. During the period 1-31 August 1968 the Battery scheduled and held eight hours of formal classes in general military subjects. Average attendance at these classes was 40%. In addition each section in the Battery held an additional fifteen hours of training.

e. Logistics, Equipment and Supply. At the end of the reporting period five guns were up. M53, USMC #213242 has been out of action since 10 August 1968 for oil-cooler fan assembly and cannon assembly. Trouble is experienced with broken sight mounts with no readily explainable reason for the breakage. Several cases of blowback from the breech was experienced during the month. It is believed that this is due to faulty gas-check pads. An Unsatisfactory Equipment Report is being prepared on this item. Other arm and equipment characteristics remain satisfactory.
