





- b. <u>Intelligence</u>. The Battery received the majority of their intelligence targets and missions through the 11th Marines. As of 31 December 1968, communications were established with Line Tell, the Army Special Force unit at THOUNG DUC and targets were received direct from their position.
- c. <u>Organization and Operations</u>. The Battery's mission is that of general su port of the 1st Marine Division.
- d. Training. During the period 1-31 December 1968, nineteen hours of formal schooling were held. This included: Section training eight hours, Weapons Safety Lectures four hours, Defensive drills three hours, Code of Conduct one hour, UCMJ one hour, Embarkation two hours.


No personnel from this Battery were sent on TAD to any schools.

e. <u>logistics</u>, <u>Equipment and Supply</u>. Two guns are currently deadlined, one requiring third echelon maintenance and the other second echelon. There is a continuing problem with M100 sights and sight mounts, as well as rear split rings and gas check pads.

Both M6 Limco's are presently deadlined, one with an unserviceable track and the other requiring a new transmission.

f. Civic Action/Civic Affairs. The Battery initiated no civic actions or civil affairs during the month of December. No MedCaps were performed.







2. Entries
27 Dec 1968 - Received six or seven mortar rounds on Hill "55".
