NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Narrative

During the month of October the Battery continued to occupy two positions. Three guns and the CP were located on Hill 34. The other three guns composed the Alpha Detachment at the Northern Artillery Cantonment.

The construction of better fighting positions on the burm and improvements on the gun pits took place on Hill 34, during the month of October. Culverts are presently being installed down near the guns to help the drainage problem during the heavy rains. This construction is nearing completion.

The Alpha position also worked to improve the drainage problem around their gun pits and is continuing to improve their position at the NAC. Construction of a new FDC is about to begin out at Alpha, due to the flooded condition of the old one.

- B. Intelligence. The Battery received its intelligence and target acquisition from 11th Marines. The Battery received its additional intelligence data from Headquarters, 1st Tank Battalion along with Local security information.
