

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Narrative

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During the period 1-31 August, the Battery continued to occupy three positions. The Command Post was located at Hill 34, while three guns composed the Alpha Detachment at the Northern Artillery Cantonment. The remaining three guns composed the Bravo Detachment on Hill 65. Work continued at the Bravo Position in the improvement of gun pads and bunkers. At all three positions preparations were still underway for the on-coming monsoon season. This work consisted of providing for drainage around each position and the replacement of old sandbags. On 8 August the Command Post Position received one 122mm rocket. No damage or injury to equipment or personnel was suffered. The Battery continued in support of Operation Pickens Forest until 24 August. On 25 August Operation 5th Mobile Strike Force commenced with the battery in General Support.

- B. <u>Intelligence</u> The Battery received intelligence information and target acquisition from 11th Marines. Additional intelligence data was received from the Southern Sector Defense Command along with local security Information.
- C. Organization and Operations. The Battery continued with the mission of general support of the 1st Marine Division. Operation Pickens Forest ended on 24 August with the Battery providing general support. 5th Mobile Strike Force Operation commenced on 25 August, the Battery again providing General Support.
- D. Training. During the month of August 1970, the Battery personnel received fourteen hours of formal training, three hours of weapons safety, and four hours of Fam Firing of the 50 caliber machine gun, M60 machine gun, M16 rifle, M79 grenade launcher and M61 hand grenades. Also ten hours of section training was held for each section in the Battery. Six new personnel were given a Vietnamese Orientation lecture by the Commanding Officer.
- E. Logistics, Equipment, and Supply. During the month of August 1970, this unit submitted four hundred twenty three requisitions to the supply source. Of these requisitions forty-nine were completed, fifty-four were cancelled, and twenty-eight were voided. There was four requisitions for a major end item. Fourteen DX transactions took place in August, four of which were completed. At present this unit remains in C-1 status.



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F. Civic Action/Civil Affairs. The Battery initiated no Civic Action or Civil Affairs Program during the month of August. No MedCaps were held.

2. Entries

On 21 August, Operation Pickens Forest terminated.
